How is DSI working?

Using the power of technologies like open hardware, online marketplaces and digital fabrication, can empower people to take more control over their responsibility to preserve the planet for future generations. Here are few examples of initiatives:

- Making Sense: Giving citizens the power to monitor their environment (pan-EU). Making Sense is running nine pilots in three European cities to measure things like noise pollution, gamma radiation and air pollution.
- OLIO: Sharing food to reduce waste (UK). It is a free app that connects neighbours with each other to share leftover and unwanted food.
- Precious Plastic: Putting recycling in the hands of everyone (Netherlands). It is a is an open hardware project offering a new way to recycle plastic.
- The Restart Project: Supporting citizens to repair, not buy (UK). The Restart Project is a London-based social enterprise that supports people to repair and reuse electronics
